At the initial commit we want basically move from Untracked to Staged, for staging we have to indicate which file we want to move or specify a pattern, as example:

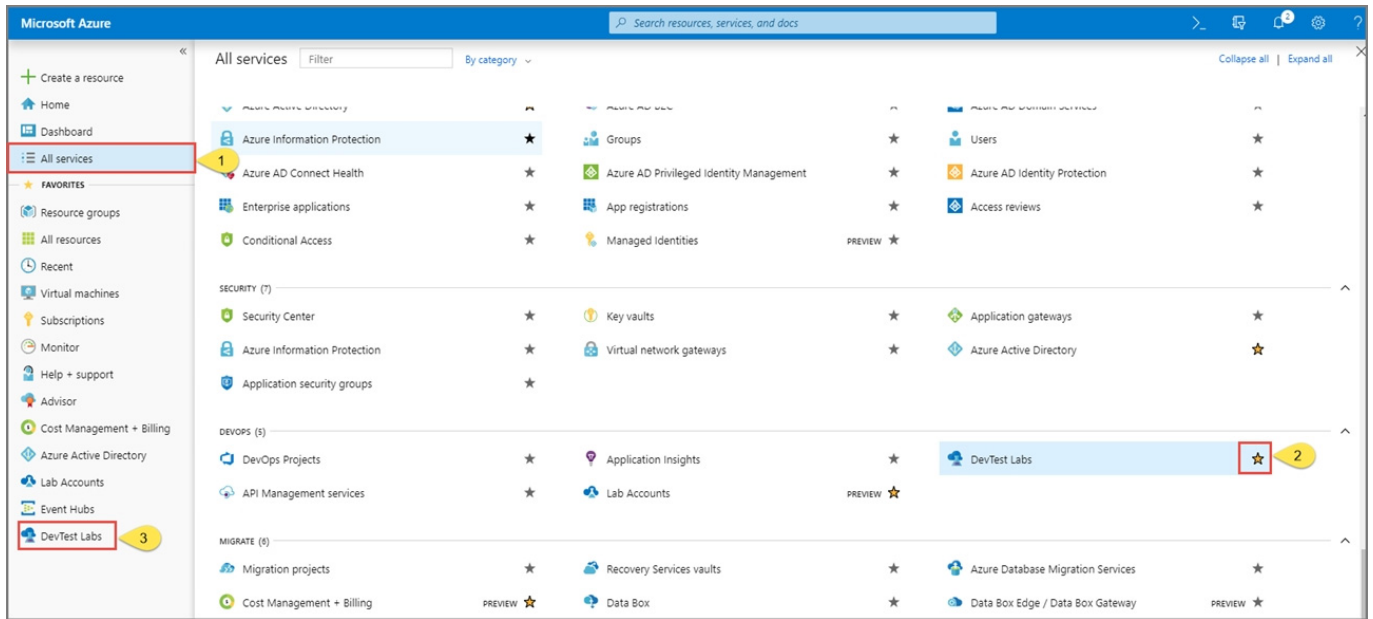
Select automation options at the bottom of the page above the Submit button.

Box 1: repo1 repo URL Manually import a repo using git CLI You can follow these steps to manually import a repo into an Azure DevOps Services repo by replacing TFS with Azure Repos in the following steps.

1. Clone the source repo to a temporary folder on your computer using the bare option, as shown in the following command line example, and then navigate to the repo's folder. When cloning using the bare option, the folder name includes the .git suffix. In this example, <https://github.com/contoso/old-contoso-repo.git> is the source repo to be manually imported.

```
git clone --bare https://github.com/contoso/old-contoso-repo.git cd old-contoso-repo.git
```

Box 2: repo1

2. Create a target repo using TFS 2017 RTM, and make a note of the clone URL. In this example, https://dev.azure.com/contoso-ltd/MyFirstProject/_git/new-contoso-repo is the URL for the new target repo.

Run the following command to copy the source repo to the target repo.

```
git push --mirror https://dev.azure.com/contoso-ltd/MyFirstProject/_git/new-contoso-repo
```

Explanation:

Box 1: MAJOR Semantic Versioning 2.0.0 Summary Given a version number MAJOR.MINOR.PATCH, increment the MAJOR version when you make incompatible API changes

Note: Additional labels for pre-release and build metadata are available as extensions to the MAJOR.MINOR.PATCH format.

Box 2: Minor How should I handle deprecating functionality? Deprecating existing functionality is a normal part of software development and is often required to make forward progress. When you deprecate part of your public API, you should do two things: (1) update your documentation to let users know about the change, (2) issue a new minor release with the deprecation in place. Before you completely remove the functionality in a new major release there should be at least one minor release that contains the deprecation so that users can smoothly transition to the new API.

Box 3: Minor MINOR version when you add functionality in a backwards compatible manner

Incorrect:

* Patch PATCH version when you make backwards compatible bug fixes

The Secure Development Lifecycle (SDL) Guidelines recommend that teams perform static analysis during the implementation phase of their development cycle.

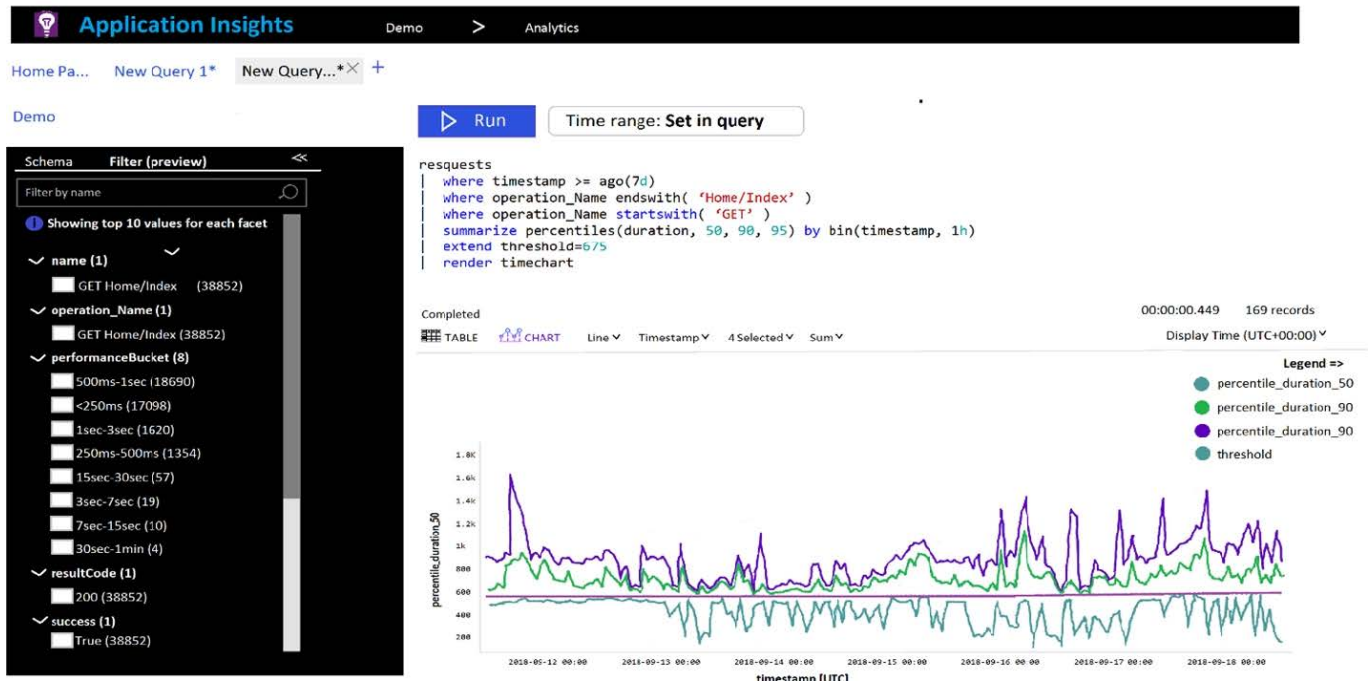

QUESTION 13

You have a Microsoft ASP.NET Core web app in Azure that is accessed worldwide.

You need to run a URL ping test once every five minutes and create an alert when the web app is unavailable from specific Azure regions. The solution must minimize development time. What should you do?

- A. Create an Azure Monitor Availability metric and alert.
- B. Create an Azure Application Insights availability test and alert.
- C. Write an Azure function and deploy the function to the specific regions.
- D. Create an Azure Service Health alert for the specific regions.

There are three types of Application Insights availability tests:

1.

URL ping test: a simple test that you can create in the Azure portal.

2.

Multi-step web test

3.

Custom Track Availability Tests

Note: After you've deployed your web app/website, you can set up recurring tests to monitor availability and responsiveness. Azure Application Insights sends web requests to your application at regular intervals from points around the world. It can alert you if your application isn't responding, or if it responds too slowly.

You can set up availability tests for any HTTP or HTTPS endpoint that is accessible from the public internet. You don't have to make any changes to the website you're testing. In fact, it doesn't even have to be a site you own. You can test the availability of a REST API that your service depends on.

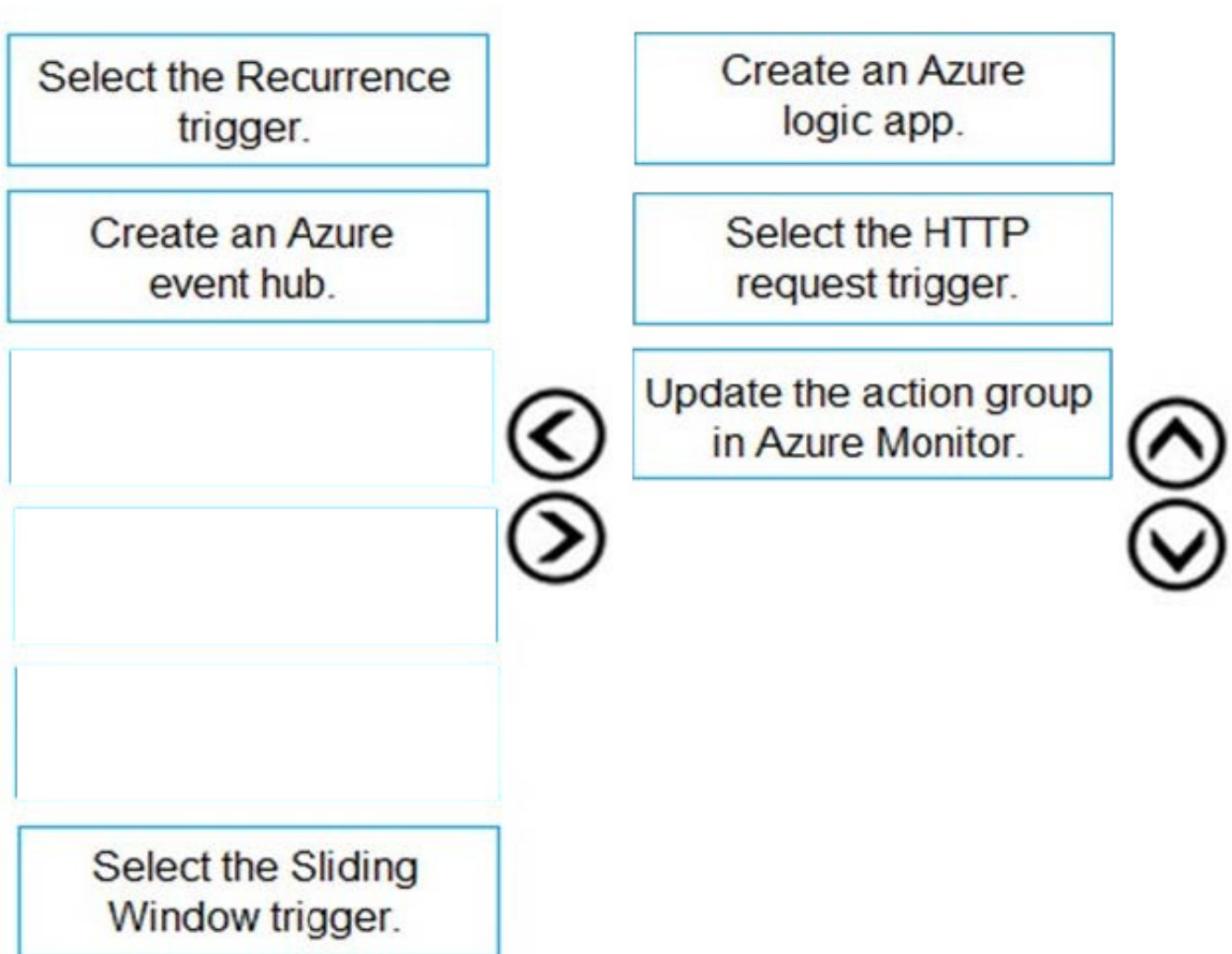
